Award-winning duo Dailey & Vincent to perform at 15th Annual Bluegrass in the Pavilion at the Flagler Museum

PALM BEACH, FL - The [Henry Morrison Flagler Museum](#), celebrating its 60th Anniversary, has announced multi-award-winning duo Dailey & Vincent will perform at its annual [Bluegrass in the Pavilion](#) concert on April 18, 2020 at 3 p.m inside the Flagler Kenan Pavilion. All proceeds from ticket sales benefit the Flagler Museum’s education programs for children.



Dailey & Vincent, hailing from world famous stages such as Carnegie Hall and the Ryman Auditorium, is riding a wave of critical acclaim for their new release, *Patriots & Poets*, as well as their nationally broadcasted weekly TV series, *The Dailey & Vincent Show*, on RFD-TV. Backed by one of the best bands on tour today and generally regarded among the most reputable and elite entertainers in American music, Dailey & Vincent’s sound is a concoction of traditional country, gospel and bluegrass blended together by the fantastically distinctive vocal blends of Dailey’s tenor and Vincent’s reedy harmonies.

“Stand back or face the force of nature that is this astounding ensemble,” wrote respected critic Robert K. Oermann for *Music Row Magazine*.

“This show in Palm Beach is just as relevant as all the other great festivals and bluegrass shows out there, and worthy of your attention,” wrote Jamie Dailey in a blog post on [BluegrassToday.com](#). “Out of the hundreds of bluegrass shows where I have performed, the Flagler Museum’s Bluegrass Music event is certainly in the top 5 of all time.”

Jamie Dailey and Darrin Vincent are Grand Ole Opry Members, five-time GRAMMY® award-winners individually, three-time GRAMMY® award-winners collectively, four-time DOVE Award winners, and winners of 35 International Bluegrass Music Association (IBMA) Awards altogether (including three-time IBMA Entertainer of the Year award winners and three-time Vocal Group of the Year award winners).

The Museum was honored to be a recipient of a 2018 Event of the Year Special Award Nomination from the IBMA.

“We are thrilled to have Jamie and Darrin returning to our stage for our 15th annual Bluegrass in the Pavilion Concert! We feel as if they are our own ‘house band,’ given how generously they give of their time to be here at the Flagler Museum for our bluegrass concerts. We are ever grateful to Board President George Matthews for launching and supporting our annual Bluegrass in the Pavilion concert, and for bringing Dailey & Vincent into our world. The Museum launched the Bluegrass in the Pavilion series in 2006, adding the April concerts to its roster of annual programs. Bluegrass in the Pavilion performers over the years have included Doyle Lawson & Quicksilver, the Kruger Brothers, the Larry Stephenson Band, Michael Cleveland and Flamekeeper and others.

The Flagler Kenan Pavilion, located on the southeast side of Whitehall, houses Henry Morrison Flagler's private Railcar No. 91 as well as the Museum's seasonal Café des Beaux-Arts, which reopens this year on November 29th. Designed by Palm Beach-based Smith Architecture Group and built by West Palm Beach-based Hedrick Brothers Construction, the 8,100 square foot pavilion was designed in the style of a 19th Century railway palace and was the first Beaux-Arts style building built in the United States in six decades. The pavilion features panoramic views of Lake Worth and the West Palm Beach skyline.

The Henry Morrison Flagler Museum

When it was completed in 1902, Whitehall, Henry Flagler's Gilded Age estate in Palm Beach, was hailed by the *New York Herald* as "more wonderful than any palace in Europe, grander and more magnificent than any other private dwelling in the world." Today, Whitehall is a National Historic Landmark and is open to the public as the Flagler Museum, featuring guided tours, changing exhibits, and special programs. The Museum is located at One Whitehall Way, Palm Beach, FL 33480.

The Museum is open from 10:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday, and noon until 5:00 p.m. on Sunday. Admission is \$18 for adults, \$10 for youth ages 13-17, \$3 for children ages 6-12, and children under six are free. Guided tours, audio tours, printed self-guide brochures and the Flagler Museum Audio Tour app are all complimentary with Museum admission. Audio tours and self-guide brochures are available in English, Spanish, French, German and Portuguese.
