Rescheduled Bluegrass in the Pavilion concert caps off busy week at the Flagler Museum

*Award-winning duo Dailey & Vincent headlined the scaled back April 10th performance
Concert marks 15th bluegrass show held in the Flagler Kenan Pavilion*

PALM BEACH, FL - Ticket holders who held onto their reservations for last year's postponed Bluegrass in the Pavilion concert at the [Henry Morrison Flagler Museum](https://www.flaglERMuseum.us) were treated to a scaled-back, socially-distanced show this past Saturday, April 10th at 3 pm inside the Museum's Flagler Kenan Pavilion. Approximately 100 people attended the rescheduled performance, which was headlined by award-winning duo Dailey & Vincent and opened by Joe Mullins & The Radio Ramblers.

The 15th annual concert capped off a busy week at the Museum that also included the 8th Annual Empty Your Pantry Food Drive in collaboration with the Town of Palm Beach United Way on April 3rd and the launch of PICNIC by the Café des Beaux-Arts on April 6th.

"We were so grateful to be able to safely offer this live music event to our loyal bluegrass fans and Museum Members," said Erin Manning, Executive Director of the Flagler Museum. "Many in attendance expressed their joy in being able to experience live music in the vast space that is the Flagler Kenan Pavilion, and we appreciated everyone adhering to our safety guidelines. The 15th annual concert was quite a celebration!"

To mark the 15th anniversary of the Bluegrass in the Pavilion program, Jamie Dailey and Darrin Vincent took a heartfelt moment out of their show to pay tribute to George G. Matthews, President of the Museum's Board of Trustees. They presented him with a plaque of recognition for his support of the musical genre and the annual event in Palm Beach.

Jamie Dailey and Darrin Vincent are Grand Ole Opry Members and hold multiple GRAMMY, DOVE and IBMA Awards, including IBMA Entertainer of the Year and Vocal Group of the Year. Bluegrass veteran Joe Mullins and his band mates Jason Barie, Adam McIntosh, Randy Barnes, and Jeff Parker (who recently replaced founding member Mike Terry) are also fan favorites, holding multiple IBMA and SPBGMA Awards.

The Flagler Museum launched the Bluegrass in the Pavilion series in 2006, adding the April concerts to its roster of annual programs. Performers over the years have included such notable acts as Doyle Lawson & Quicksilver, the Kruger Brothers, Michael Cleveland and Flamekeeper, and the Larry Stephenson Band.
